Monza

The royal park circuit in Monza is the fastest track in Formula 1, with average speeds of 240 kph. Here the cars run with the lowest possible downforce to gain high speeds on the straights. The key to this race is the Parabolica corner - a long and fast 180-degree corner.

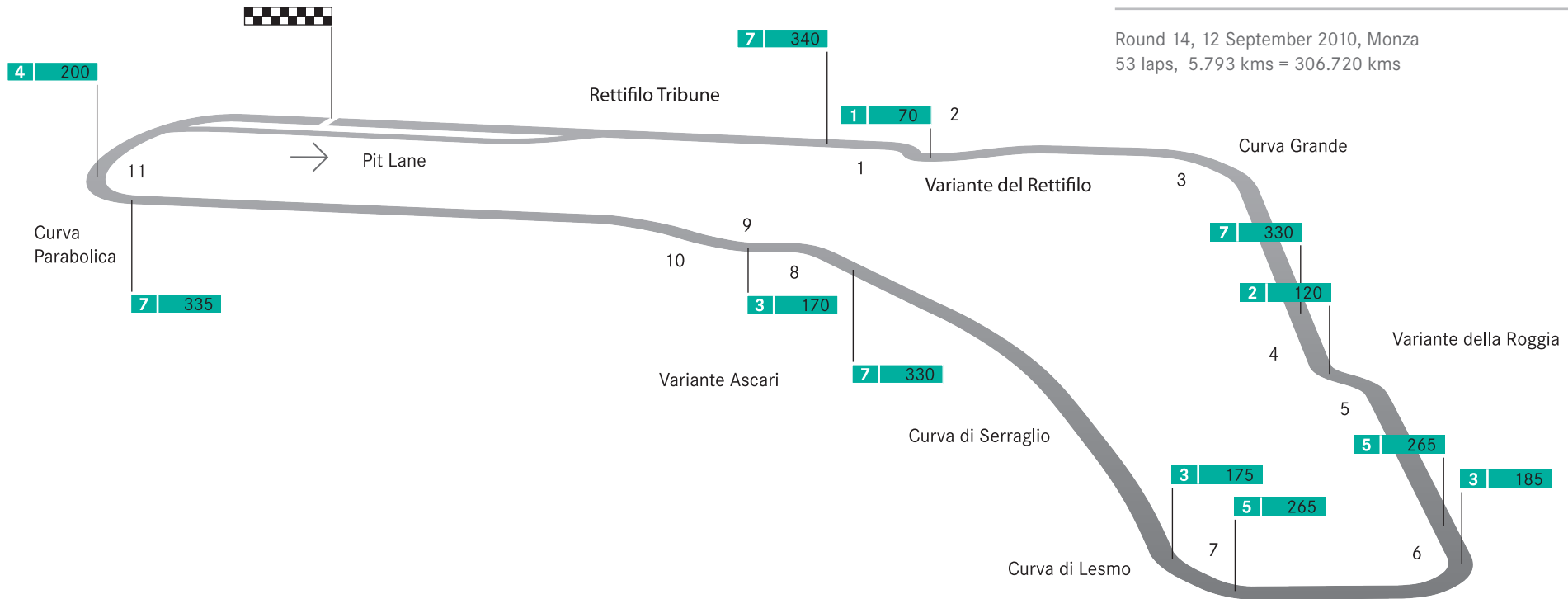

Race Information › The Italian Grand Prix

The Italian Grand Prix has been held every year since the start of the Formula One World Championship in 1950, the only one alongside the British Grand Prix to which this applies. No country's Grand Prix was more often held on one circuit than Italy's in Monza - 58 out of 59 times. Only in 1980 did the Italian Grand Prix move to Imola.

The history of Italy's Grand Prix began in 1921 on the 17.3 kilometre circuit in Montichiari near Brescia. After 30 laps and 519 kilometres, the Frenchman Goux won driving a Ballot.

In January 1922, the decision was made to build a permanent race track in the Royal Park, Monza. Work started on 15 May and

was completed in 110 days. The grand opening took place on 3 September, and one week later the Italian Grand Prix (only the second one there had ever been), was held on the new track.

Monza holds the record for the fastest ever Grand Prix driven by Michael Schumacher (Ferrari) in 2003 with 247.585 kph.

Last year, Brawn Mercedes driver Rubens Barrichello took victory ahead of his team mate Jenson Button. Adrian Sutil in a Force India Mercedes finished fourth and posted the fastest lap of the race. On the final lap, Lewis Hamilton who had started from pole position retired from third place due to an accident.

History ›

Mercedes-Benz Motorsport

The return of the Silver Arrows in the 2010 Formula One World Championship with the new MERCEDES GP PETRONAS Formula One Team begins the latest chapter in the proud 116 year history of motorsport success for Daimler and Mercedes-Benz.

The Silver Arrows were born on 3 June 1934 when Manfred von Brauchitsch won the Eifel-

rennen at the Nürburgring at the wheel of a Mercedes W25. The car's white paintwork had been sanded down to meet the weight requirements and the car raced in the silver colour of its aluminium body.

On 4 July 1954, the Silver Arrows returned for the first time: Juan Manuel Fangio drove his W196 streamliner to victory in the French

Grand Prix at Reims which he won ahead of his team mate Karl Kling. It was the first Formula One race win for Mercedes-Benz.

Mercedes-Benz has been a force in motor sport since 1894. The first four cars home in the race from Paris to Rouen on 22 July in that year were powered by a 954cc V2 engine designed by Gottlieb Daimler. This victo-

ry set the ball rolling and in subsequent decades, the marque won countless races. For the Nice-Salon-Nice race of 1901, Daimler's cars were entered under the name Mercedes for the first time, named after the daughter of the Daimler importer and racing driver, Emil Jellinek. The event was won by the Mercedes of the German driver Wilhelm Werner.
